Epilogue

December 12, 1981 - June 9, 2004

Back at the church, the mood at the luncheon was more that of a family reunion as the Brason family and their closest friends enjoyed each other's company over the lovely meal provided by the Relief Society. Commander Reubens and his wife and the detachment from the Brason were invited as well. The sailors particularly enjoyed a home cooked meal. Ensign Jamison cornered Craig and had all sorts of questions about the things that he had heard and felt during service. Craig answered all of his questions and told him how to contact the missionaries in Hawaii, which he promised to do.

Again that evening, Ramona had a house full of people, which really helped her from feeling so alone. The next day the entire family attended church together, along with some of their out of town friends.

Understandably many of them had to leave on Sunday to return home, as did the men from the Brason.

On Monday, the family members who lived out west had to go home too. Except Norma stayed a few days just so Ramona wouldn't be all alone in the house. Besides she needed to look in their Diet Centers. But after a few days, she also went home. Craig and Edith and the boys and their wives were good to look in on her.

The plan had been for the family to come home for Christmas, but having just been there for the funeral changed all of that. The holidays were rather subdued that year as Ramona spent it with Craig and his family. Norma and Janet called her often to see how she was doing and to check up on her.

During the first weeks and months of 1982, Ramona had good days and days that weren't so good, as she missed Sheffield. She put off going through his things until spring. After sorting out what she wanted to keep, she let the kids and grandkids pick through the things that they wanted. As for Craig, he wanted the Staggerwing. Although his Bonanza was newer, the old Staggerwing was a better plane so he sold the Bonanza and bought the Staggerwing and continued to use the hangar and landing strip.

Spring always brought new hope as the earth came back to life. In March Todd and Rachel had their baby, a boy who they named Sheffield Curtis Brason. In May Todd graduated from Virginia Tech and quickly found a job in the Los Angeles area, near Rachel's family. So that meant another of the family had moved out west. Then the day before Mothers Day, Gean had her baby, who they named Jessica. Jessica brought the number of great grandchildren to thirteen and number fourteen was on the way with Tina expecting in November.

The day after Ramona celebrated her seventy ninth birthday, she flew out west with Craig and Edith in the Staggerwing to attend Jessica's baby blessing in Burley and to spend the summer. On Sunday afternoon Norma and Wade took her home with them. She stayed with Norma through June and July and was there when Marty returned from his mission at the end of July. Janet and Jerry came up to his home

coming and they took Ramona back to Clarkston with them.

In August, the entire family got together at Granite Creek for their first family reunion without Sheffield. Then at the end of the month, Wesley returned from his mission. While she was in Clarkston, Tina came and got her so she could spend a couple of days with her in Preston as well. Towards the end of September, she flew to California to spend a couple of days with Todd and Rachel before returning home. Being away for the summer helped with her healing. Being with the kids and grandkids was better than being alone in the house.

In November, Tina had her baby, who they named Brandon Robert Carter. Ten days later, Ramona flew out with Craig and Edith to see the latest edition to the family and to have Thanksgiving at Janet's home were everyone gathered except for Geoff and Todd.

The next couple of years presented some big changes. First of all, Ramona celebrated her eightieth birthday on June 3, 1983. After Geoff had fulfilled his commitment to Lewis-Gale Hospital, Roy told him about an opening for a computer programmer at Diet Center in Rexburg where he worked. While out west for the family reunion he interviewed for the job. A couple of weeks later he was offered the job and they moved to Rexburg soon after that. That left only Ramona and Craig and Edith still in Virginia. They often talked of moving out west to be near the rest of the family.

Then a reason to do so presented itself. After working at the Roanoke Regional Airport for all of those years, a major change in management put him out of a job, but not without a considerable severance offer. His last day on the job was June 29,1984. At fifty two years old finding a new job wouldn't be easy, but he, Edith, and Ramona flew out west to see what he might find. First they stayed a few days with Gean and Nathan in Burley, but they didn't find a reason to settle there. Next they stayed several days with Tina and Mark in Preston and Craig scouted around in Cache Valley, but again came up empty.

Craig was particularly interested in the regional airports and had been to the airports in Twin Falls and Logan, but they had nothing for him. He even looked into some of the crop dusting services. Surely someone somewhere would need his particular skills and abilities when it came to propeller aircraft. He figured that he would have to go to a bigger city like Salt Lake, but first he wanted to see what the airports in Idaho Falls and Pocatello might have to offer. Someone told him that he might even try the one in Jackson, Wyoming.

After coming up empty so far, they went up to Rexburg to stay with Todd while he looked around. All the while Ramona tagged along and enjoyed the grandkids and great grandkids. Once they went to Rexburg, she stayed with Norma while Craig looked for work. He ran into the same roadblock at the Idaho Falls Regional Airport. But he did learn of a company called Phoenix Warbirds that had just moved from Southern

California and had set up shop in a hangar adjacent to the airport. The reason they called they themselves Phoenix Warbirds was because their specialty was restoring vintage military aircraft to flying condition. Literally making old plane rise from the ashes into a mint condition aircraft. They had customers from all over the country.

What they did sounded interesting to him, so he decided to see what they were up to. He found that they were currently working on an F4U Corsair, a TBM Avenger, two P-51 Mustangs and had a AD Skyraider and a P-47 Thunderbird setting outside just waiting until they could get to them.

Craig explained that he had worked on Skyraiders when he was in the Navy and knew them inside and out. They weren't interested in hiring just another mechanic but they were interested in someone to invest in the business as a partner. That excited Craig and he told them that he had fifty thousand dollars that he needed to do something with.

Craig's looking stopped right there. His efforts turned to working out the legalities and contract issues, which took a couple of weeks. They also needed to find a place to live. He and Edith looked at several homes in Idaho Falls and found one near the airport that they made an offer on, contingent on selling their place back in Virgina.

Ramona had a much easier time of finging a place to live. Norma and Wade still had the pad where the HUD trailer that they lived in after the flood had sat. The power pole was still there as were the hookups to the well and its own septic tank. They told Ramona that it would be perfect for her to put something on so she would have a place of her own. She agreed and decided to purchase a three bedroom double wide mobile home to have brought in.

With that all settled, Craig, Edith, and Ramona flew home to get their affairs in order for the move. They both put their homes up for sale and within two weeks Ramona had an offer for the Two Star Ranch, which she accepted. A few days later, Craig had an offer on his place as well. While the deals were going through, Ramona sold off everything she had; all of her furniture and appliances, Sheffield's car and old pickup, the tractor and equipment, and even her beloved Mustang. The only thing she was unable to part with was Geannie's old piano, which she gave to Gean. Since she was named after Geannie, who was her great aunt, it was only fitting that she have her piano.

She began packing up the things that she wanted to take with her; her clothes and the sentimental items that she wanted to hang on to. It amounted to enough to set up in her new home in Rexburg. The sale on her property went through first so she had everything shipped to Rexburg for Wade to put in storage until she was ready to move in.

In the meantime, she stayed with Craig and Edith until the sale on their house closed. To make the

move easier, they too sold everything with the idea of replacing it when they moved into their new house. The rest they had shipped as well. On the Sunday before leaving, Craig was released as the Bishop of the Salem Ward. With just the luggage that they had held back, they took off in the Staggerwing from the Two Star Ranch for the last time on the 27th of July and set out to rejoin the rest of the families in Idaho and Utah.

The deal on Craig and Edith's new home went trough and they were able to move in while still in the closing process. Once settled, he began his dream job. Ramona on the other hand stayed with Norma and Wade while her mobile was being built. She had specified extra insulation in consideration of the cold Rexburg winters. In the meantime, Wade worked on getting the site ready, including setting up a carport. She bought all new furniture and and brand new 1984 Ford Thunderbird.

When her home was finished, it was brought out and set up and she moved in. It was much easier for her to keep up than their big house back in Virginia. Her yard was much smaller too, and Wade took care of it for her. The only thing she missed was her bathhouse. To solve the problem, she had spa room built on the patio, just outside of the kitchen through the double sliding glass doors, and had a jacuzzi installed in it.

Now all of the family was reasonably close, with the exception of Todd and Rachel in California. In the meantime there were a few additions. In 1983 Teresa and Roy had a baby boy, named Parker, in February. Geoff and Brenda had another little girl in July, who they named Crystal. Then in 1984, Samantha and Collin had a baby boy, named Ryker, in January. Todd and Rachel had a baby girl born to them, who they named Alisha, in March. And Tina and Mark had a little girl named Jennifer in July. That brought the number of great grandchildren to eighteen.

Now that Ramona lived closer, she was able to see all of them frequently, which made her much happier and miss Sheffield less. No longer would she miss important events like baby blessings and baptisms. She was also now able to attend more of their school functions and other ativites as well. In addition to the newest great grandchildren, Marty married Melinda Grunnell in the Idaho Falls Tempe on August 11, 1984. Pearl graduated from high school in May and both Wesley and Andrea were engaged to be married.

Because of the size of the family, it was determined that it was no longer practical to spend three days camping at Granite Creek. Beginning that year, it became a one day event, hosted by Craig, Norma, Janet and Takara on a rotating basis. That year it was Janet's turn and was held at Downata Hot Springs, just off Interstate 15 about half way between Logan and Pocatello.

At eighty one, Ramona was in great shape. Her gift of youth continued to betray her true age by fifteen years. She was able to go anywhere and do anything she wanted. Rather than volunteer at the hospital one day a week like she had done in Virginia, she worked in the Idaho Falls Temple once a week on

Wednesdays.

The fall of 1984 was a busy time for Janet's family, with two weddings. In September Andrea married Richard Hermanson from Logan and in November Wesley married Ann Carpenter from Brigham City, Utah. Both were married in the Logan Temple and both settled in Cache Valley.

Now that the entire family lived out west, They were able to get together for the holidays as a family. That year those who could, which was most of them, had Thanksgiving dinner at Craig's new house.

Over the next several years, there were more additions to the family. 1986 was the most prolific year as five more great grandchildren were added that year; Jason Carter in July, Patrick Gover in September, Stephanie Hermonson and Heather Pendleton both in October, and Kyle Rowan in December. Also included in that batch was Ashley Rogers in February 1987.

Ramona grew old gracefully as she turned eight three in 1986. Since moving to Idaho she had been back to Virginia five times. Twice with Craig and Edith and three times with Wade and Norma, as they still had family in Roanoke, and Wade and Norma had their Diet Centers. Anytime someone invited Ramona to go someplace with them, she was was ready and willing to go.

One of those occasions was in the spring of 1986 when Ramona accompanied Craig and Edith to attend the funeral for Edith's mother, Mary Ann, who died at the age of ninety one. While there they stayed in the home of Edith's sister, Misti and Rupert Casper.

They had heard on the news and subsequently from family in Roanoke of the flooding that had occurred the previous November as a result of the remnants of Hurricane Juan. After several days of heavy rain between October 31st and November 6th, including six and half inches on 4th, the Roanoke valley had the worst flooding ever recorded there when the Roanoke river crested at twenty three and half feet above flood stage claiming ten lives and causing \$440 million dollars in damage just in the Roanoke area alone. The Two Star Ranch and other homes and businesses along the river, including Craig and Edith's home, were either heavily damaged or washed completely away.

Rupert drove them past where they used to live to find that there was nothing left. The house, the barn, the hangar and everything was gone. The property had been swept clean. Further up the road, on the other side of the river, Craig and Edith's house was also gone. It was heart wrenching to see it, as all of the memories of living there for thirty seven years came flooding back. They were glad that they had moved away when they did.

Eventually the property was bought up by a developer and what was once the Two Star Ranch became home to some self storage units, a strip mall, a pancake house, a bowling alley, a grocery store, and several apartments down along the river. A couple of retail stores went up on Craig's place as well.

Ramona made another trip to Hawaii in December 1986, five years after Sheffield died and finally got to finish their vacation that had been cut short when he died. She attended the forty fifth reunion of the Pearl Harbor Survivors and finally made it to the the other islands to visit the people and places from their mission.

The only grandchild still not married was Pearl. After graduating from Utah State University in 1988, she served a mission in Honduras from July 1988 to January 1990. After returning from her mission, she Married Robert Cooper from Salt Lake City in the Logan Temple on October 12,1990 and settled in the Salt Lake Valley. During that time, four more great grand children were born, three in 1988; Jonathan Hermanson in February (on leap year), Erin Carter in March, and Rebbecca Rowan in July of 1989.

There were other changes in the family as well. In 1990, Geoff went to work for the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory in Idaho Falls. Diet Center had been sold and the new owners pulled out of town, leaving more than two hundred people out of work. Geoff was fortunate enough to get hired by the INEL right away. For some time the company had been failing and Norma and Wade had to close their franchises in Virginia.

In December of 1991 at the age of eighty eight, Ramona made another pilgrimage to Hawaii for the fiftieth anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor and to revisit their mission once more. It was the last time she ever returned to the Paradise that she loved so much.

The following year, Todd and Rachel wanted out of California, particularly after the Rodney King riots. Geoff told him of some engineering positions at the INEL and he applied and was hired. When they moved to Idaho Falls, that meant that all of the family was within two hundred fifty miles. Now at thirty two, Rachel's Multiple Sclerosis had progressively become worse.

Ramona celebrated her ninetieth birthday on the 3rd of June 1993. The kids made a big deal out of it and held an open house in her honor. For her age she was doing extremely well. She had the energy, vitality and looks of a seventy five year old woman. By then she had long since stopped dying her hair and let go it's natural silvery white. She still lived in her own home, took care of herself and still drove her car. She had traded her 1984 Ford Thunderbird 1992 Thunderbird, with a sun roof.

The kids were getting older as well. In 1994, Wade turned sixty five and retired from Ricks college. Then in 1996 Craig also retired and sold his interest in Phoenix Warbirds.

By then, six more great grandchildren were born; Daniel Cooper and Brandon Gover in 1992, Arron Rowan in 1993, Angela Gover and Chelsea Cooper in 1995, and Meagan Rowan in 1996. They were followed by Jasmine Cooper in 1998 and Dylan Cooper in 2001. That was the last of the great grandchildren, making a total of thirty eight. Even before the last of the great grandchildren were born, the older ones had began to grow up. Some of them had already served missions, graduated from college, got

married and began having children of their own.

All of this time, Takara and her family remained an integral part of the Brason family and came to most of the family gatherings. Their children grew up and married and had families of their own. Teancum worked for the Church until he retired in 1998.

Ramona had never dreamed that she would live to see the year 2000, but on New Years she watched the new millennium come in as it was celebrated around the world. There had been some concern that it would have a catastrophic affect, because computers would not now how to process the transition. Geoff, the computer expert in the family, assured her that the so caller Y2K bug was nothing to worry about.

The beginning of the new century didn't seem much different from the end of the old one, but the difference between the beginning of the twenty first century and the beginning of the twentieth century was a stark contrast. It wasn't even the same world that she had grown up in. Ramona embraced the change and even had her own computer, with access to the Internet. She found it fascinating.

Later that year, Ramona accompanied by Norma and Janet went to San Diego for the decommissioning of the USS Brason. After serving the United States Navy for twenty years she was withdrawn from service. But that was not to be the end of her usefulnesses. Immediately after she was decommissioned and her crew left the ship, she was commissioned into the Mexican Navy as the ARM Cárdenas F-215.

Over the years, Ramona had corresponded with her various commanders. She had remained in touch with Commander Reubens even after he turned over command of the Brason to his successor and after he had retired from the navy, himself a rear admiral. She had also kept in touch with Ensign Jamison who resigned is commission after completing his six year commitment to the Navy Reserve. He had made good on his promise to contact the missionaries when he returned to Hawaii after Sheffield's funeral and a short time later had joined the church. He had come to see Ramona on a couple of occasions over the years.

It wasn't very far into the new century before it was marred by the age old menace of war and hatred. On the morning of September 11, 2001 Ramona was anxiously awaiting word of the birth of her thirty eighth great grandchild, when the morning show on the television was interrupted with live coverage of the terrorist attack on New York City and Washington D.C.. It was December 7th, 1941 all over again as she remembered the destruction that she had witnessed that day. She watched on the television as the a second hijacked airliner full of people crashed into the World Trade Center and then later witnessed it come down.

Less than a month later, the United States was at war with the terrorist organization in Afghanistan who had taken responsibility for the attacks, vowing the bring down the United States like it had done with the twin towers of the World Trade Center. It was a different kind of war than the ones that Sheffield had fought.

It was a different world, one that would never quite be the same again.

Ramona's one hundredth birthday on June 3, 2003 was celebrated as had her ninetieth. During the last decade, she began to slow down considerably, although she still lived in her own home, next to Norma and Wade. Her gift of youth began to fade. Rather than a fifteen year difference, it was more like a ten a difference. Even with feeling like she was ninety, she was in pretty good shape. Her mind was sharp and her memory clear. She was relatively healthy and still had a cheerful disposition and positive outlook on life.

Then on the night of June 9, 2004, just eight days after her one hundred and first birthday, she went to sleep in her own bed and a little before midnight Sheffield came for. At the time they had nine great grandchildren in addition their thirty eight great grandchildren and eleven grandchildren, not counting Takara's family. She was buried in Roanoke, Virginia on the other side of Sheffield. A single headstone marks the final resting place of Sheffield Brason and his two wives.
